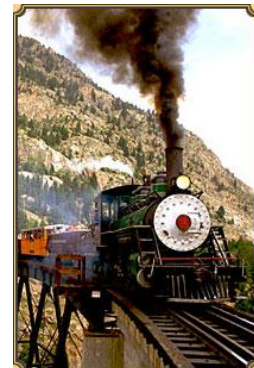
June 6



Today finds us at Harriet Hargrave's Treadle Arts Quilt Shop for an Antique Quilt Lecture circa 1840 by Harriett. The Treadle Arts shop has a full line of fabrics including an extensive collection of reproduction and thirties fabric, lots of books, patterns, projects and batting including Harriet's Heirloom line.

Lunch is down the street at Vincenza's Restaurant and Bakery.

The Georgetown Loop Railroad brings Colorado history to life in a fun adventure that will thrill you. The beauty of the rugged Rocky Mountains surrounds you as the old-time steam locomotive winds up the Clear Creek Canyon, hauling your train past the remains of several gold and silver mines and at one point crossing over a 90-foot (27 m) high trestle. The fully enclosed as well as open cars allow a breath taking view of everything along the line. Gift shops at both ends of the line offer outstanding selections of railroad themed items, books and clothing.



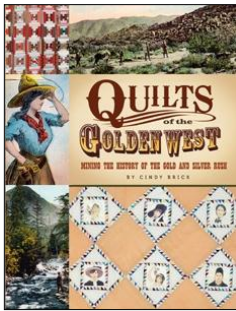
The 16th Street Mall Downtown Denver was designed 25 years ago by I.M. Pei and is a mile-long pedestrian promenade lined with outdoor cafes, flower baskets, retail shops and restaurants. You will find numerous fountains and plazas offering a variety of daily special events and entertainers. Free shuttles travel both directions the entire length of the Mall from early morning to late at night. They stop at every intersection so it's easy to

cover a lot of ground in a short period of time.



June 7

We head south to Castle Rock to the studio of Cindy Brick, an editor, designer and writer who travels the world teaching quilting and quilt history. The former editor of Quilter's Newsletter has written 6 books such as Quilts of the Golden West and Crazy Quilts.



We eat lunch at Augustine Grill, a quaint old home built in 1902, in Castle Rock.



After lunch we enjoy a private tour at the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum and gift shop. Then enjoy historic Golden at your own leisurely pace. While walking around town consider stopping in at the Golden Quilt Company, the Creative Crafts Groups publishing gallery, and the many shops lining the historic downtown area.



June 8

We travel up to Boulder to the Celestial Seasonings Tea Company for a private tour of the factory, buy teas in the gift shop and eat lunch in the Café. We continue going north to Windsor for our own quilt shop hop adding 3 more quilts shops to the tour.



Then onto the Austin Homestead Bar and Grill for fine dining on

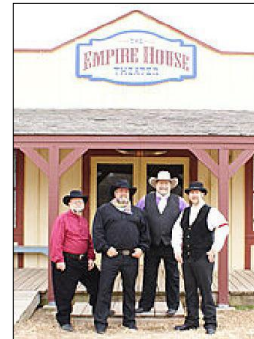
Pelican Lakes. Located in Northern Colorado, among the scenic fairways and spectacular greens of the Pelican Lakes Golf Course in Windsor,
